- Statewide Education Plan: Regina Everett is Education chair for MoHIMA. Jeff McGraw contacted AHIMA to hold a Train the Trainer session in Missouri. Discussion from MoHIMA meeting included having the educational institutions offer remedial and foundational educational programs (A&P, pharm, etc.) and use certified trainers to do educational sessions of 1.5-2 days throughout state from 2011-2013. ICD-10 Implementation

Ten for Ten: Ten Tasks to Lead the Way to Successful ICD-10 Implementation

Healthcare organizations nationwide have successful ICD-10-CM/PCS implementation in their strategic tool kits. HIM professionals play a critical role in this transition. It's not too soon to consider what AHIMA component state associations (CSAs) can do to get the word out about preparation and training and provide the tools the industry will need. Here are 10 things a CSA can do right now to lead the way:

1. Make a plan for CSA activities for 2011 and 2012 to serve member needs
2. Prepare communications to show your members where they can find ICD-10 implementation tools.

3. Highlight ICD-10 member preparation activities on your state's Web site
4. Communicate to your members about ICD-10 training opportunities that are available locally or in your state
5. Use the ICD-10-CM/PCS Leadership Model (<http://www.ahima.org/about/leadershipmodelsforehim.aspx>) to grow state leaders for this initiative
6. Energize regional and local coding roundtables by coordinating special programs connected to statewide planning
7. Include preparation guidance in your newsletters
8. Consider developing outreach programs to physicians to heighten ICD-10 awareness
9. Convene a discussion forum with health insurance providers to establish common ground and sharing of information about the new code sets
10. Lead the way to successful ICD-10 transition in your state by 2013
